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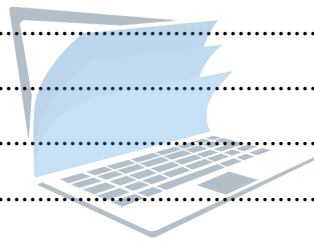

1. Plastics which is totally artificial cause many environmental problem today. Plastics are mainly derived from petroleum and natural gas derivatives. A wide range of additives are used in the plastic processing industry so that the desired characters such as flexibility, colour, resistance to microbes etc. could be obtained in the final product.
2. The plastic material buried in the soil will lead to soil infertility. When it rains, these buried material could be carried into the waterways perhaps interrupting its smooth flow of water. The overflow of water experienced in urban areas (roads etc) during a heavy shower is.
3. It is ironic that the same properties of plastic that lead to its success – resistance to both water and chemical aggression – have created environmental concerns currently neither a developed nor a developing nation has so far found a perfect solution to this problem. The available options to curb this problem are outright banning of plastics, burning, restricting the import and use of raw material and finished products through the operation of proper legal and fiscal measures.
4. With the introduction of a consumer life style in Sri Lanka, the quantity of discarded plastics has increased, thereby creating a serious problem the entire country. In order to resolve this problem the government has stepped in by giving the needed facility to establish a plastic waste recycling plant in Sri Lanka.
5. In order to ensure the success of a plastic waste recycling process there are three major factors that should be considered. They are,
  - (a) efficient collection of discarded plastics.
  - (b) technology to convert the discarded plastics into new product.
  - (c) improvement and organization of marketability of the recycled final product.

• **Question : 03**

**Read the following text and do the activities that follow.**

**(20 Marks)**

An upsurge of new research suggests that animals have a much higher level of brainpower than previously thought. If animals do have intelligence how do scientists measure it? Before defining animals' intelligence, scientists defined what is not intelligence.

Instinct is not intelligence. It is a skill programmed into an animal's brain by its genetic heritage. Rote conditioning is also not intelligence. Tricks can be learned by repetition but no real thinking is involved. Cueing, in which animals learn to do or not to do certain things by following outside signals, does not demonstrate intelligence. Scientists believe that insight, the ability to use tools, and communication using human language are all effective measures of the mental ability of animals.

When judging animal intelligence, scientists look for insight, which they define as a flash of sudden understanding. When a young gorilla could not reach fruit from a tree, she notices creates scattered about the lawn near the tree. She piled the creates into a pyramid, then climbed on them to reach her reward. The gorilla's insight allowed her to solve a new problem without trial and error.

The ability to use tools is also an important sign of intelligence. Crows use sticks to pry peanuts out of cracks. The crow exhibits intelligence by showing it has learned what a stick can do. Likewise, otters use rocks to crack open crab shells in order to get at the meat. In a series of complex moves, chimpanzees have been known to use sticks in order to get at a favourite snack termites. To make and use a termite tool, a chimp first selects just the right stalk or twig. He trims and shapes the stick, then finds the entrance to a termite mound. While inserting the stick carefully into the entrance, the chimpanzee turns it skilfully to fit the inner tunnels. The chimp attracts the insects by shaking the twig. Then it pulls the tool out without scraping off any termites. Finally, he uses his lips to skim the termites into his mouth.

Many animals have learned to communicate using human language. Some primates have learned hundreds of words in sign language. One chimp can recognize and correctly use more than 250 abstract symbols on a keyboard. These symbols represent human words. An amazing parrot can distinguish five objects of two different types. He can understand the difference between the number, colour, and kind of object. The ability to classify is a basic thinking skill. He seems to use to use language to express his needs and emotions.

The research on animal intelligence raises important questions. If animals are smarter than once thought, would that change the way humans interact with them? Would humans stop hunting them for sport or survival? Would animals still be used for food, clothing, or medical experimentation? Finding answers to these tough questions makes a difficult puzzle even for a large – brained, problem – solving species like our own.

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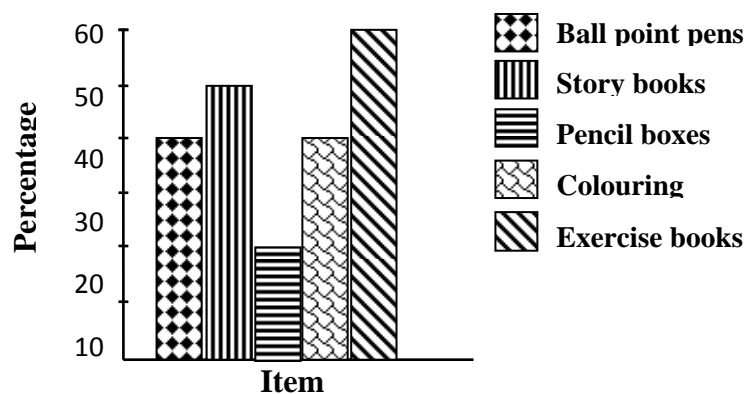

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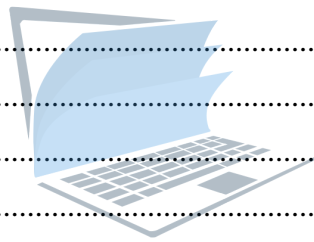

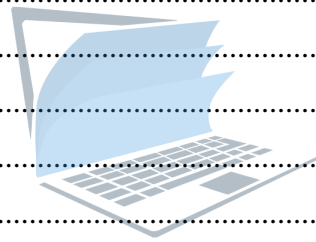
